"Livelihood Support to farmers through Rural Backyard poultry rearing" under State plan during the year 2023-24

Introduction

Raising improved local poultry breeds in backyard is an important source of livelihood for the rural people of Odisha. Backyard poultry rearing gives high return, since the cost towards raw material and maintenance are low. The birds can be easily reared and handled by the farmers in village condition. Improved Low input technology birds like Vanaraja, Chhabro, Kuroiler, Rainbow Rooster, Kalinga Brown, RIR and Other approved breed of GoI etc. have high meat quality, good body weight and are disease resistant.

A small backyard flock can meet the egg and meat requirements of a farmer household and also provides additional income. A valuable by-product is the chicken manure which is an excellent organic fertilizer. The dual purpose low input technology birds are reared under scavenging condition. These indigenous birds are hardy with egg laying capacity (up to 120-125 eggs per year) and high weight gain capacity (2.5 kg to 3 kg at 4 months). The eggs are brown coloured and fetch good price compared to white shelled eggs.

Under the scheme, individual farmers belonging to SC/ST, Transgenders, differently able (Min 40% disability)category and poor farmers will be provided with 50 nos of unsexed 4wks old Low Input Technology(LIT birds).

Aim & Objective

The project intends

- To support the nutritional requirement of the people through consumption of animal protein.
- To promote backyard poultry rearing to enhance incomes of rural people.

Strategy

31,377 Individual farmers belonging to SC/ST, Transgenders, differently able (Min 40% disability) category and poor farmers will be supported for rearing 50 unsexed Low Input Technology (LIT) poultry birds under State plan during the year 2023-24 with 100% subsidy. Community level volunteers like PraniMitras/Gomitras can be roped in for vaccinating the poultry birds reared at backyard.

Selection of Farmers

- This scheme will be implemented for the individual farmers (both male & female) belonging to SC/ST, Differently Able (Min 40% disability) category, poor farmers and Transgenders.
- While availing subsidy, beneficiary family will be considered instead of individual member of family. One beneficiary family should not be provided with multiple benefits under one particular scheme. A family will not be eligible for subsidy under the same scheme if any of its members has got subsidy during last three years.
- i. The certificate of identity as transgender persons issued by District Magistrate as per 'The Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019" will be accepted for Transgender category.
- ii. For differently able persons the certificate if disability issued by certifying authority / competent authority indicating 40% or more disability as per "The Rights of Persons with Disability Acts, 2016" will be accepted.
 - The district wise indicative target of beneficiaries to be covered is shown at Annexure-1. The Director AH&VS may revise the district target as per the demand.
 - The beneficiaries to be covered under the scheme shall be Aadhar linked to prevent duplication.
 - The beneficiaries will be selected in transparent manner and the list of the farmers with signature of the concerned LI and the PRI members will be submitted to the concerned BVO.
 - The BVO after countersigning the beneficiary list will submit the same to the concerned CDVOs for approval.
 - Block wise training of the beneficiaries shall be organized by the BVO. 50 farmers in a batch will receive training on recommended management practices including brooding, feeding, watering and rearing young chicks on backyard poultry out of the IEC funds.
 - The Pranimitras/ Gomitras, will be oriented at Block Hqr by AVAS/ BVO regarding recommended management practices in backyard poultry. They will be roped in to guide the farmers in field for managing backyard poultry units.
 - Small-scale poultry units in the backyard will be managed by householdsusing family labour.
 - A Night Shelter will be constructed before receiving chicks by the beneficiaries using local available materials with minimum expense. The assistance of Rs 500

will be provided to each farmer for construction of a night shelter through DBT.

- The farmers will arrange feed for chicks during the early stage as per the availability of local ingredients. The birds will be reared in free range system with little hand-feeding especially kitchen-wastes.
- 50 numbers of four wks old unsexed Low Input Technology (LIT) birds will be distributed to each farmer in two phases (25+25) with a gap of 2 months.
- Geo-tagged photographs of each backyard poultry unit should be recorded.
- Timely disease prevention measures through routine vaccination and other healthcare programs will be taken up to minimize occurrence of diseases and thus preventing mortality of birds.
- Quality checking of chicks procured by the beneficiaries shall be ensured by concerned BVOs.
- All data with regards to the scheme should be entered online in the DSS Portal at block and district level.
- The daily progress report will be uploaded in the online DSS portal by CDVO.
- Administrative Cost will be given to CDVOs to meet the expenditure incurred towards monitoring & supervision of the scheme.
- The block wise final list of the beneficiary will be uploaded in the Directorate website.
- Subsidy will be released to the beneficiaries in their bank account through DBT mode only.

Supply Chain

As the quantity of chicks to be supplied is huge in nos, Govt. Hatcheries/farms as well as the Private suppliers may not able to supply all the required nos of chicks. Moreover, if the farmers procure individually, the overhead expenses will be more, as the number of chicks per farmer is less and chicks will be purchased in two phases. So, the CDVOs will facilitate the distribution of chicks to maintain proper quality.

Procurement of 4 wks old unsexed LIT birds can be made from Govt. Poultry Farms/ hatcheries, Chick Rearing Units established under State Plan, NLM & Mother unit of Backyard Poultry scheme as well as from empaneled poultry bird suppliers. The empanlement of Private poultry birds suppliers will be made by Directorate AH & VS, Cuttack following due procedure & the list of suppliers will be intimated to CDVOs later.

Monitoring

Regular monitoring will be done by the SDVO Concern along with ADVO LP under the direct supervision of the CDVO. The Directorate of AH & VS will coordinate and monitor the progress of implementation of the scheme every fortnight.
