7	Selection procedure	<p><b>Selection of individual farmers: -</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The willing farmers/ entrepreneurs /ST, SC, Women, Transgender &amp; Differently Able (min 40 % disability) beneficiaries will be eligible to avail support &amp; can set up duck farm.</li> <li>2. The certificate of identity as transgender persons issued by District Magistrate as per 'The Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019" will be accepted for Transgender category.</li> <li>3. For differently able persons the certificate if disability issued by certifying authority / competent authority indicating 40% or more disability as per "The Rights of Persons with Disability Acts, 2016" will be accepted.</li> <li>4. 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**its members has got subsidy during last three years.** However, if any member of one family gets the benefit as a member of WSHG, then the other family member can avail any other scheme as in a group activity profit for each of the group members may not be enough.

7. The BVO shall compile the Block wise applications and thereafter undertake a joint verification in transparent manner of the proposed poultry unit. The Block Level Inspection Team shall comprise of the following members

1. BVO/AVAS /VAS/ MVU VAS
2. Concerned Livestock Inspector/LT/ LEO

Verification will be made by any veterinarian as allotted by the concerned BVO, but signature of verifying Vet of the concerned VD & concerned BVO is mandatory.

The block level inspection team will take geo tagged photographs (minimum 4 photos from all angles of the site & 1 photo with all members from middle) of the site at the time of initial inspection. The team has to ensure that the proposal is a new project & also mention whether the individuals are optioned for shed or not.

8. On recommendation by the Block Level Inspection Team, the respective BVO shall **forward the online applications of individuals to the CDVO.**
9. **On receipt of e-applications by the CDVO, a District Level Committee comprising of Chief Development Officer-cum-Executive Officer, Zilla Parisad, CDVO, ADVO (LP), ADVO AW, District Project Coordinator, Mission Shakti, District Project Manager, OLM and Project Administrator, ITDA (Concerned area), Chief District Agriculture Officer, Executive Eng Agri / Asst. Ex Eng. under the Chairmanship of the Collector & District Magistrate shall approve the final list of beneficiaries of the district. More applications may be approved in DLC so that in case of any denial, the other applicants in queue may be issued go-ahead.**
10. After approval of the list, Go-ahead letter to the eligible farmers will be issued by the concerned

		<p>CDVO as per <b>Annexure- II.</b></p> <p>11. Then Go ahead will be issued by concerned CDVO.</p> <p>12. A beneficiary can apply under the scheme either opting for shed construction or without shed construction component.</p> <p>13. The applicants opted for "No shed", land details are not mandatory. The applicant opted for "Shed", land patta/ ownership details / land Lease documents are mandatory.</p>	
8	Implementation strategy	<p><b>(If opted for shed)-</b></p> <p>1. After issue of go-ahead letter, the individual will construct the duckery unit and other infrastructure like <b>Construction of Disposal pit for waste disposal</b>, carcass &amp; litter disposal pit.</p> <p>2. After completion of the shed the beneficiary will intimate the Local BVO/ AVAS in the format enclosed at <b>Annexure-III.</b></p> <p>3. The block level Inspection Team will inspect the duckery shed &amp; <b>Disposal pit</b> for carcass &amp; litter disposal pit within 2weeks period from the date of intimation by the beneficiary. They will take geo-tagged photographs of entire unit along with the beneficiary.</p> <p>4. The Inspection Team will upload &amp; submit the geo-tagged photographs of entire unit and recommend to the concerned CDVO for release of 1<sup>st</sup> phase subsidy i.e 40% of the eligible subsidy <b>Annexure-IV.</b></p> <p>5. Then the beneficiary will start rearing the ducklings. After induction of 1000 nos. of day-old ducklings,, the beneficiary will intimate local AVAS/ BVO in the format enclosed at <b>Annexure-III.</b></p> <p>6. Thereafter, the block level Inspection Team will inspect the fully stocked duckery unit. They will take geo-tagged photographs of the duckery Unit and recommend to the concerned CDVO for release of the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase subsidy i.e 60% of the eligible subsidy. <b>Annexure-IV.</b></p> <p>7. The individual members belonging to SC, ST, Women, Transgender &amp; PWD (min. 40% disability) will be provided a maximum of 60% subsidy and individual belonging to General male will be provided a maximum of 50% back ended</p>	



subsidy of the unit cost.

8. The eligible subsidy amount shall be released back ended to the bank account of the individual farmers through DBT mode only **through Unified payment layer system (UPL)** in two phases i.e. 40% of the eligible subsidy after construction of the duckery shed & disposal pit in the 1st phase and 60% of the eligible subsidy after stocking of the unit in the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase with due asset verification by the inspection team.

**If not opted for shed -**

9. After issue of the go-ahead letter, the individuals will construct the Disposal pit for waste disposal, carcass & litter disposal pit & then arrange the litter materials, feeders, drinkers etc required and then induct the 1000 nos. of day-old ducklings under supervision and guidance of the Block Level Veterinary officer within 1 month of issue of go-ahead letter.
10. Then the beneficiary will intimate local AVAS/ BVO in the format enclosed at **Annexure-III**.
11. Thereafter, the block level Inspection Team will inspect and will take geo-tagged photographs of the stocking of ducklings and recommend to the concerned CDVO for release of the eligible subsidy. **Annexure-IV**.
12. The eligible subsidy amount shall be released back ended to the bank account of the individual farmers through DBT mode **by Unified payment layer System (UPL) in Go-sugam portal** only in single phase as mentioned **in the subsidy provision** with due asset verification by the inspection team.
13. The individual members belonging to SC, ST, Women, Transgender & PWD (min. 40% disability) will be provided a maximum of 60% and individual belonging to General male will be provided a maximum of 50% back ended subsidy **of the recurring cost as mentioned in the subsidy provision**.

14. No additional manpower or Consultants shall be engaged for implementation of the scheme. This scheme shall be implemented with existing field

The individuals will fix the sign board on the details of the scheme (Scheme name, year of implementation, beneficiary name and address, cost of the project, unit size, unit cost, subsidy etc.</p> <p>16. Beneficiary can use own land or land on lease basis.</p> <p>17. The district wise indicative target is shown at <b>Annexure -V</b>. The Director AH&amp;VS may revise the district wise target as per the demand and progress of implementation.</p> <p>18. The selected individuals to start the construction work at least within 2 months of issue of Go-ahead letter (if optioned for shed). In case of failure to do so, a formal notice must be served to initiate the work within 15 days failing of which the go ahead issued will be cancelled and issued to another eligible individual either new / in the waiting list approved by the DLC.</p> <p>19. The applications of eligible and willing farmers who have already applied for establishing units under similar scheme in Go- Sugam for the year 2025-26 and are under waiting list shall be considered for the financial year 2026-27 on priority. For the applications (for the year 2025-26) the concerned block and district officers are to contact with the beneficiaries and obtain his/her consent to establish the unit for the yr. 2026-27 so that application can be placed in the DLC for approval and issue of Go- ahead letter.</p> <p>20. 24. CDVOs in consultation with Lead District Manager of the concerned district shall take steps for arranging bank loan to the farmers for successful implementation of the scheme as per the requirement of the individual.
25. The BVO will provide all technical guidance to the individual farmers for maintaining proper veterinary health care and immunization of the ducks.
26. **Construction of two Disposal pits** i.e one for litter material disposal & another for carcass disposal pit must be constructed by the beneficiary while construction of duckery shed. For bio-security measures construction of foot bath shall be done before entry of duck unit.

Carcass disposal pit shall be constructed inside the farm campus with dimension of 35 cubic ft per 200 birds with fencing & sign board. Carcass disposal pit should be 2 meter deep and half filled with waste, then covered with lime within 50cm of the surface, before filling the rest of the pit with soil. On each occasion, when waste is added to the pit, a layer of 10 cm soil shall be added to cover the waste.

**Technical parameters:**

- Straight run (unsexed) Khaki Campbell ducklings will be supplied assuming male female ratio as 50:50.
- Ducks will be reared in All in and all out system.
- The mortality of ducks will be average 5% during the period of rearing.
- Ducks will produce 250 eggs in first year of lay i.e. up to 72 weeks.
- Ducks will be reared in semi-intensive system and will be allowed to nearest water body for collecting food.
- Feed cost for 25 to 72 weeks (48 weeks) will be borne by the farmers from sale proceeds of egg and hence



- this has not been taken into expenditure component.
- It is proposed to make feed by using available ingredients like broken rice, maize, de oiled rice bran, maize, de-oiled rice bran, mineral mixture, salt, oil cake to minimize the price of feed .
  - The male ducks at the age of 5-6 months will be sold.
  - Supplementation of home grown materials like azolla, berseem, cow pea and other spinaches can reduce the feed cost.
  - The female ducks will be maintained up to 1 ½ yrs. of age after which the total stock will be disposed for meat purpose.
